

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

Conditions of Play

LADIES: In Grades as designated by the Match Committee.

MEN: In Grades as designated by the Match Committee.

1. A player in any grade is eligible to win the championships with the best Gross score and will be declared "CHAMPION".
2. A tie for Champion, or the Gross in all grades/divisions will be decided by a sudden death playoff commencing, and if necessary, repeating Hole 18 until a winner is established.
3. A tie for the nett in all Grades will be decided by a count back on the last 18 holes as per Golf Australia guidelines.
4. The playing handicap of each player on the first day of the Championships will determine in which grade/division they will compete in, not the GA handicap.
5. If a player's handicap alters during the championships, then the handicap on which she/he commenced the championships will be used in deciding the overall nett score. Current handicaps will be used in deciding the daily nett score. Local rules in force at the time of play will be adhered to.
6. The draw for the Championships will be a **seeded draw on the fourth day** with the leading **four (4) ladies from each Grade, and the leading four (4) men in each Grade**, in the last groups of the day. To be eligible to win the Gross Event, players **MUST** play in their position in the seeded draw.
7. A player may only win either a gross or nett trophy in all grades.
Trophies: - Best Gross – Grades as set down by the Match Committee
Best Nett: - Grades as set down by the Match Committee
Rundown: - calculated each day
Pin Shots: - In all divisions as set down by the Match Committee.
8. The use of distancing measuring devices is permitted in accordance with GA recommendations. All members are permitted the use of motorized carts in all gross and nett events. All phones must be on 'silent'.
9. In the event of the course becoming unplayable the Match Committee has the right to reduce the championships to a 54- or 36-hole event. Competition field size for ladies is 5 and for men is 8.
10. Specific qualifications for Honour Board events. Members wanting to enter any honour board event must have played in **5** or more normal club competitions (in the calendar year of the honour board event as evident in Golf Link data) to qualify to play in that competition. Club events are defined as normal weekly competitions and any other event(s) as decided by the Management Committee.
11. To be eligible to play in any honour board event players must be **FULL** member, Provisional members are not eligible. In the case of a medical condition, on production of a medical certificate, the nomination will be decided by the Match Committee.
